What is Title I

Being a Title I school means receiving federal funding (Title I dollars) to supplement the school's existing programs. These dollars are used for the following:

- Identifying students experiencing academic difficulties and providing timely assistance to help students meet the state's challenging content standards.
- Purchasing supplemental staff/programs/materials/supplies.
- Conducting parent and family engagement meetings/trainings/activities.
- Recruiting/Hiring/Retaining Highly-Qualified Teachers

Being a Title I school also means encouraging ongoing parent and family engagement and advocating for parents' rights.

Parent's Rights Under Title I

Parents have the right to request information about the degree certification of their child's teacher(s) and instructional assistant(s). Whether the teacher:

- Has met the state qualification and licensing criteria for the grade level and subject area in which the teacher provides instruction.
- Is teaching under emergency or provisional status through which the State qualification or licensing have been waived.
- Is teaching in the field of discipline of the certification.
- Whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals, and if so, their qualifications.

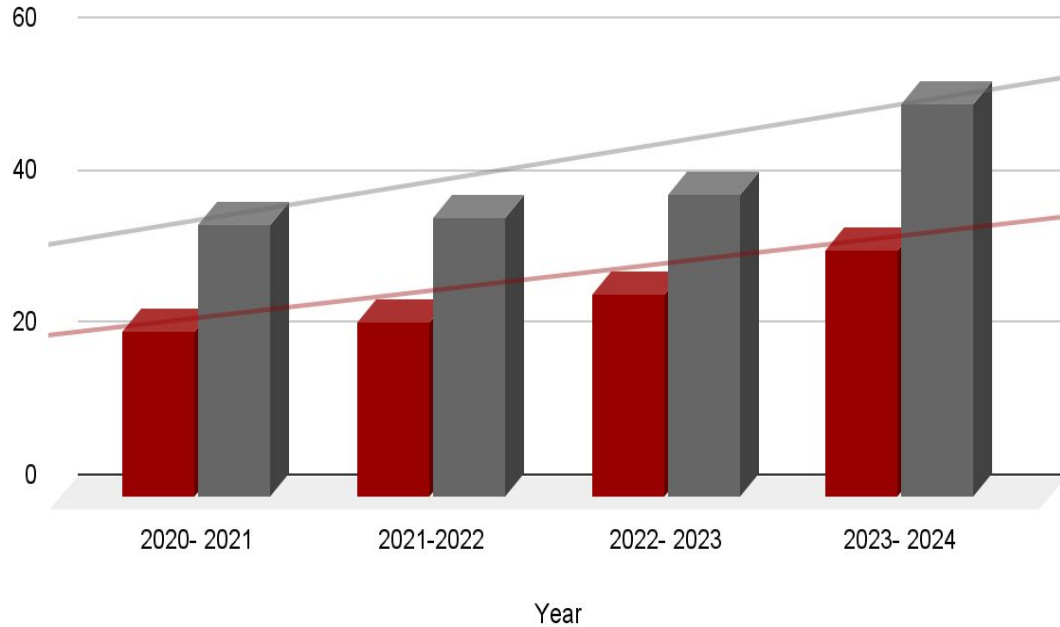
School Performance
